Linda Martin Receives Alpha Phi's Achievement Award Honor



inda Martin of Eta Chapter received the 2016
Alpha Phi State Achievement Award, the state's highest honor, on September 17. State President Dr. Marilyn "Susie" Rogers presented Linda with the Achievement Medallion.

Linda has been a member of DKG for many years. She has served her chapter as president and has been on almost every committee in the chapter as either the chairman or as a member. At the state level, Linda was a regional director and state recording secretary. She was chairman of the Scholarship Committee multiple times and chaired the Finance and Long-Range Planning Committees

In attendance at ten state conventions, Linda was on the Host Committee for at least two of those conventions. She also attended State Leadership Development Workshops and an International Northeast Regional Conference.

The profession of education has benefitted greatly from the work Linda has completed in the field of mathematics. With a BA degree from Fairmont State College and her Master's Degree from West Virginia University, Linda is certified in English, Social Studies, Mathematics, and Elementary Education. She has taught in three elementary Schools and one middle school.

Linda has been an active member of NEA, WVEA, and the Berkeley County Education Association. She was a member of the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics, and the Society of Elementary Presidential Awardees (SEPA).

Her contributions to educa-

tion are many, and a few highlights include being a Mentor Teacher, serving on the first RESA Drug Awareness Committee, and being a WV Teachers' Academy Fellow. As a workshop presenter, Linda attended the WV Leaders of Learning Conference with a workshop on Geometry Activities K-12, the Potomac Valley Council of Teachers of Mathematics, and the WV Council of Teachers of Mathematics at Fairmont State College.

In 1985, Linda published the book *Problem Solving Experiences in Mathematics for Fourth Grade.* She has also conducted training sessions on how to score the WV-STEP and led workshops for Title I in Logan, Mercer, and Ohio Counties.

Linda assisted with the preparation of a \$25,000 Education First Grant for her school, served on textbook selection committees, and the Advisory Council for WV Department of Education Instructional Materials Adoption Committee.

Honors Linda has received include WVCTM Elementary Mathematics Teacher of the Year (1987); Teacher of the Year in her school and county (1988); a member of the WV Leading Mathematics into the Twenty First Century Taskforce (1990); received the WV Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics Teaching (1990); received the National Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching Mathematics (1990); and received the Ashland Oil Golden Apple Award (1993).

Although Linda retired in 2013, she has not slowed down. She is active in her church, volunteers at "Starting Points," the local

Soup Kitchen, and is a member of the Red Hat Society.

The Future of Teaching

y introduction to DKG came when Lambda Chapter (now my own!) honored me as Outstanding Future Teacher in high school. My induction into the Society in the '80's came at a time when young teachers filled the ranks. This year a national survey of college freshmen by UCLA's Cooperative Institutional Research Program reported fewer students plan to major in education than at any time since 1971.

I asked college freshman education majors to share questions about entering the teaching field. Here are some of their concerns:

How do teachers control a hyper class? How does the teacher create a bond with each student? Can I actually handle teaching in an inner city school? How can I make my students want to learn? Can you truly teach a certain subject if you have to teach to a test?

How do you handle parents? Can the state department fire teachers because of standardized test scores? How do we use technology in class? How do you motivate child to learn? How do teachers handle bullying and violence? What

should be my backup plan if I don't get a teaching job?

Perhaps your chapter can discuss some answers to these questions. Future teachers are future DKG members!


