

At the end of the year, our collected funds are sent to Schools

for Africa through Delta Kappa Gamma. I never gave this much thought until my husband and I went on a Rotary Mission trip in October. While there I became much more aware of the need for schools and school supplies in Africa.

Our primary mission with Rotary was to promote water and sanitation projects. At every community we visited, we met with the village elders and the members of the community. First, they needed a bore hole for water. Secondly, they wanted Rotary to help with micro flush toilets to replace pit toilets. In some villages, not even pit toilets existed.

Guess what they wanted? After these basic needs were met, they wanted a school. In one community, the chief had given some land for a future school. This was one step ahead of other communities. Many communities did not have a school. In these communities, the older children walked up to seven miles to attend school and the younger children were not able to go to school

t every DKG meeting, at all. We heard impassioned pleas for schools in the commuwe are fined 25 cents if nities so their children could get an education.

We visited some schools on our trip and took school supplies to them. In our tour of these very basic schools, up to ninety students could be in one classroom. Some schools had tables or desks but many did not. Students sat in the hard-packed earth and listened to their teachers. All of the young people we observed were very attentive and focused because school was a privilege, not a necessarily a right in Ghana. Ghana is a land of contrasts.

The teachers in the community schools were very dedicated. If a community has a school the government will assign a teacher to the school. We asked for and were given lists of school supplies. One young teacher desperately wanted stock paper so he could make flash cards. Others had a need for workbooks which they used over and over without ever writing in them. Our team was able to provide some supplies to them. In one school, they had a ceremony thanking us for the supplies we were able to give them.

I do not know what other clubs other than Xi chapter do to donate to Schools for Africa. Take the time to find out what your club does and communicate with all of us. Share ideas in our *Alpha Phi Newsette*.

- State Founders Scholarship (\$1,000) Awarded for doctoral or postdoctoral study.
- 3. Past State President's Memorial Honorary Award (\$750) for a member pursuing a master's degree.
- Professional Workshop/Seminar Scholarship - (\$100) for a DKG member attending an educational workshop or seminar.

Delta Chapter met Octoat the Phelpsber 7 Tavenner House Parkersburg for a living history program about the establishment of Wood County and the founding of Parkersburg. Paul Bibbee, retired professor at West Virginia University-Parkersburg, portrayed Isaac Tavenner in his presentation. The Tavenner family acquired the house in 1823. It is believed to be the oldest house in Wood County, having been built 1799-1800.

During the business meeting which followed the program and a tour of the house, the Literacy Committee reported that books have been ordered for the literacy project which provides books for pediatricians' offices to be given to their patients. Books donated by Delta Chapter members were collected and were delivered to the local Boys and Girls Club.

Two women were initiated into Delta Chapter at the November meeting. Stacey Smith is a first grade teacher in Ritchie County. She holds a Master of Arts degree in Reading and has 18 years experience. Rose Murphy, a kindergarten teacher in Ritchie County, holds a Bachelor of Art degree in Elementary Education and has been teaching for 24 years. Books, puzzles, and games that are appropriate for middle and high school students have been donated to The Kathleen and John Faltis Children's Shelter. The Faltis Shelter provides an emergency shelter to children who are homeless, abused or neglected; many who arrive with few personal belongings.

Nu Chapter also supports the local libraries in Summersville, Richwood, and Craigsville. Monetary donations collected at the December meeting were given to the Craigsville Public Library.
