In addition to her work with Real Aloud, she has served on the boards of a variety of organizations. She currently serves on the Faculty Merit Foundation of West Virginia and was recently

named a 2014 Women of Achievement honoree by the YWCA. Mary Kay and her husband, Pat, have three grown children.

*Section A. State Executive Board

1. The members of the State Executive Board shall be the elected officers, the past state presidents who retain membership in Alpha Phi the chapter State, presidents, and the four regional directors. The parliamentarian, the executive secretary and the editor shall serve as exofficio members without vote: the treasurer also shall serve as ex-officio member. with vote. A past president who serves as parliamentarian shall relinguish her voting privilege during her term of office except for a ballot (International vote. Standing Rule 6.02)

**Section B. State Executive Committee

1. Alpha Phi State, West Virginia, shall have an executive committee composed of the elected officers as voting members. The treasurer also shall serve as ex-officio member, without vote. The Executive Committee shall conduct business delegated to it by the board and take action on matters requiring immediate attention. Related personnel may be invited to attend as deemed necessary.

Convention CE Session Offered on Multidimensional Capacity Building

Every teacher who has chaired a committee or served as a department leader, every principal who has worked with staff to implement an improvement plan, every district or state administrator, technical assistance provider, or head of an agency who has worked with others to implement a program, is a change agent. Even the simplest change can be difficult to implement and change agents need to know how to guide the change process and build the capacity of staff to implement the targeted change. In this CE session, participants will learn about a multidimensional approach to capacity building that will help teachers and administrators implement even the most complex change.

The presenter for this session is Dr. Sharon Harsh, past president of Lambda Chapter and director of the Appalachia Regional Comprehensive Center at ICF International.
