
West Virginia State's First Virtual Convention a Huge Success

West Virginia State's first, and hopefully only, Virtual Convention was held on April 23 and 24, 2021. The theme of the 77th State Convention was "Celebrate Being a DKG Woman" and the host chapters were Beta, Tau and Alpha lota.

The convention opened on Friday night with a West Virginia History Alive presentation on Nellie Bly portrayed by JoAnn Peterson.

A busy Saturday began with a Virtual Convention Orientation which was very helpful to learn the ins and outs of virtual etiquette. The WV State Executive Board held their meeting then the General Session began. President Dr. Glenda Wait, Xi, called the meeting to order. Members were welcomed to the convention by WV First Lady Cathy Justice and Joanne Gregory, Beta, Convention Chairman. An inspirational thought using calligraphy was presented by Priscilla Marten, Alpha. 

Kay held Delta Kappa Gamma as one of her most important organizations. She was a recipient of the Golden Gift Award in 1999 and considered the Leadership/Management Seminar in Austin, TX to be a very unique learning experience. Kay held many Chapter and State offices and in 2003 served on the Planning Committee for the Northeast Regional Conference held at The Greenbrier. Kay presented papers at regional and international conferences.

To all who knew Kay, we express our deepest sympathy to her family. We will always carry warm memories of her in our hearts.

Dr. Kay Clawson was 2014-2016 Northeast Regional Director and served on the Foundation Board from 2016 until present. In the latter position, she was elected to the Educational Foundation Board of Trustees for 2016-2022 and was elected chair for the 2018-2020 biennium. During that biennium, she oversaw the merger of the Educational Foundation and the DKG Supporting Corporation and was elected to serve as chair of the new DKG International Educators Foundation after the merger (2020-2022). It was during that term of office that she passed away. Her leadership was evident in the way she guided the Foundation through the merger, and her leadership will always be remembered as the new DKGIEF continues to grow and flourish.

We will all miss Kay and her energy, wisdom, and leadership.



Remembering Helen M. Kiser

Former State President Mrs. Helen Kiser (Phi Chapter) passed away peacefully in Lakeway, Texas on May 24, 2021, at the age of 96. She served Alpha Phi State as President for the 1975-1977 biennium. Helen began her teaching career at age 19 due to a teacher shortage during World War II. For the next 43 years, she taught in the McDowell County school system at Welch Elementary School and Welch Junior High School. Taking summer courses, she completed a Master's Degree in 1963 and additional graduate studies at the University of Cincinnati.

Helen was very active in many school activities, church leadership, and civic organizations. In addition to her state and international service in Delta Kappa Gamma she was the the long—time director of her church's children's choir. She was active in the McDowell Women's Club, the Chaminade (music) Club, and the Order of the Eastern Star. Helen retired in 1987 and took advantage of her freedom to travel.

She will be remembered as a gifted teacher, organizational leader, wonderful wife and mother. She was a bright and spirited soul who was quick to make friends by being a great friend to others.

Eta





More Chapter News...

Beta Chapter has had a busy year. Besides planning for the 2021 State Convention, we had a variety of interesting programs including:

Rae of Hope - Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery for Women. Our chapter along with Alpha lota bought Christmas gifts for children of ladies that are housed there.

CASA - Court Appointed Special Advocates - Joanne discussed that as a CASA volunteer you are assigned a foster child and will connect with the child at least once a month. In addition, a written report to the judge is required once a month. Information on improvement of situation for the biological parents can be shared. Members would serve strictly as an advocate for the child. Retired teachers are considered some of the best volunteers because they understand the child's struggle. Thirty hours of training is required to participate.

Gabrielle Project – an agency that works with families of children under two years of age. Baby supplies are provided (diapers, wipes, gently used clothing, et al). No need to prove income which is especially important during this time. Only expense to parents is \$10 to receive a new car seat or playpen.

Regarding the Convention, another thank you is extended to all those who helped make it a successful adventure.
